CHRISTMAS CARDS RAISE FUNDS FOR CORNWALL AIR AMBULANCE



Market Makers member Ann Kinahan has produced a special set of uniquely Cornish Christmas cards to help raise funds for Cornwall Air Ambulance Trust.

The cards come in four designs depicting local coastal scenes and wildlife in the depths of a snowy midwinter.

'I really hope people enjoy these Cornish Christmas cards. It's a great pleasure to have created them in support of such a vital organization as Cornwall Air Ambulance Trust, and to play a small part in promoting their lifesaving work,' said Ann.

Each year, Cornwall Air Ambulance's emergency helicopter helps more than 1,100 seriously ill or injured people. Since its establishment in 1987, the service has completed more than 31,000 missions. Its £5 million annual operating cost is primarily funded by kind donations from the generous people of Cornwall and beyond.

'We're so grateful to Ann for producing these lovely cards to help support our lifesaving missions across Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly,' said Sherelle Puertas, Fundraising Officer for Cornwall Air Ambulance. 'We are incredibly lucky to have amazing supporters like Ann, who are so passionate about the work that our crew do each and every day to save lives and keep families together.'

Now in her early 70s, Ann continues to compete as an international triathlete and is also a keen member of Liskeard's Market Makers group of artists and craftspeople.
